

Know Your Area: South East Cornwall

This overview has been created as a means of **signposting** to **key information sources** for the Community Area Partnerships to support the development of new Action Plans. It is designed to highlight **specific area differences** from the Cornwall average, where the **CAP** could consider **prioritising their actions**.

Data aggregated to CAP level is broad and **specific area challenges** may exist within the CAP at a smaller area level.

For example, **national measures do not highlight South East Cornwall as a deprived area** and there are places, such as Saltash which are relatively affluent with high levels of employment and low levels of deprivation. In contrast, **Liskeard faces multiple challenges in relation to living standards and crime**. Where these distinct differences occur throughout the CAP area additional data has been provided to highlight this.

Community Insight

Local Insight gives you access to interactive maps and reports at different geographic levels showing key social and economic indicators and allowing you to compare the area selected with England and the South West. The tool is hosted on the Cornwall Council website.

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Highlights from the Insights Profile

Strengths:

- **Active and engaged** community
- **Low** levels of **unemployment** in some areas
- Proportionately higher level of **digital seniors** than Cornwall average
- Relatively low **fuel poverty**

Challenges:

- **Higher dependency ratio** – higher percentage of older people, less people of working age
- **Higher** rate of **economic inactivity**
- Level of **personal debt** notably larger
- **Liskeard is the only area to experience significant multiple deprivation** (income, employment and health); the wider population, however, experiences **geographical barriers to services**
- **Slightly higher rates of crime** at CAP level (in comparison with the rest of Cornwall, still lower than national rates) with the exception of Liskeard which is demonstrating increases in multiple types of crime
- Lower level of **lottery funding** per head than Cornwall average

[1] Dependency ratio - the ratio of non-working age (those aged 0-15 and over 65) to working age population. A high dependency ratio means those of working age, and the overall economy, face a greater burden in supporting the aging population.

[2] The Community Needs Index was created by combining a series of 19 indicators and it is conceptualised under three domains: Civic Assets, Connectedness and Active and Engaged Community. A high score indicates that the area has high levels of need.

Health and Wellbeing: Primary Care Network Profiles

Primary Care Networks (PCNs)¹ are groups of GPs working together, serving communities of around 30-50,000 people – **Cornwall has 15 PCNs** plus a small number of GP practices not yet assigned to a PCN.

PCN Profiles provide **summary health indicators** across Cornwall and information is presented for each of the 15 PCN areas. These profiles were designed to help build an understanding of the community's needs and, in doing so, identify where resources could be targeted to improve health and wellbeing and reduce health inequalities.

- An increasingly **aging population** correlating to a lower birth rate; **low projected population growth** at 0.3% (Cornwall 7.6%)
- Pressure on **residential and nursing care** provision
- **High** levels of demand for primary and secondary **free school meals**
- A sizeable proportion of **children in low-income families** (23.1%)
- More **children who are overweight** or very overweight – 15.5% of primary children (Cornwall 9.4%) and 25.9% of year 6 (Cornwall 18.2%)
- **Highest** proportion of children requiring **SEN support**

Town Economic Vitality Index

Developed by Cornwall Council, the **Town Economic Vitality Index** helps assess the needs of communities by offering a unique insight into economic challenges at town level. The Index, with other local knowledge, will help inform future funding opportunities. It brings together 12 key indicators for 22 towns.

Towns are ranked out of 22, where a rank of 1 indicates the highest combined factors negatively impacting on the town’s vitality.









Saltash is ranked **22nd out of 22** towns in Cornwall.

Strengths:

- **Highest employment** correlating to a very **low** number of **benefit claimants**
- **Low** level of **violent crime**
- Significant **lack** of **multiple deprivation**
- Strong number of premises with **Gigabit Broadband**
- Low rates of **fuel poverty**

Challenges:

- **Poor business growth**
- **Comparatively low vacancy rate** (vacancies compared with the number of jobs in the area)

Safer Towns Profile

The [Safer Towns Programme](#) provides intensive partnership support for the **ten towns with the highest levels of crime and disorder** and other issues that have an impact on community safety.

Each town has an individual profile that provides a picture of **crime and community safety issues** for each area, highlighting the main themes, patterns and trends alongside key statistics. Comparisons are provided with other and Cornwall overall.

Liskeard and **Saltash** have Safer Towns partnerships.

A note on police data

Devon and Cornwall Police are transitioning to a new record management system (Niche), which will provide enhanced functionality and analytical capability. During the transition period, officers are able to view crime and intelligence records, but a range of process and data issues means that providing strategic information is not currently possible. The latest police data currently available relates to crimes and incidents recorded in the 12 month period ending 31 October 2022.

Key messages Liskeard

- Comparatively **high rates of crime** and an **above average increase** (+34%) compared with the averages for Cornwall and other Safer Towns
- Rises in **violence, alcohol-related** crimes and **public order** offences
- **Anti-social behaviour remained static**, contrary to the reduction seen elsewhere in Cornwall. Reports of **street drinking/ begging/drug litter** were up on the previous year.
- Increase in **burglary and shoplifting**, similar to other areas (and national picture)
- **Small but increasing number of hate crimes**, mostly racist

The Vulnerability Index is a **small area risk model**, that looks at the cumulative impact of a range of community safety issues at town and small area (Lower Super Output Area²²) level. The model uses rates of incidence per 1000 resident population compared with the Cornwall average.

The most vulnerable areas highlighted in Liskeard are:

- Liskeard Town Centre West, Dean Street, Lanchard
- Liskeard Town Centre East, Sungirt, Plymouth Road
- Liskeard St Cleer Road and Bodgara Way

²² Lower Layer Super Output Areas (LSOA) are a geographic hierarchy used to report small area statistics in England and Wales. The average population in an LSOIA is approximately 1500 people.

Key areas of work for Safer Liskeard

1. Drug related harm and recovery (including drug networks/County Lines)
2. Domestic abuse and sexual violence and reducing violence against women and girls
3. Community engagement and building resilience
4. Taking pride in Liskeard and improved feelings of safety
5. Youth engagement

Key messages Saltash

- **Lower all crime rate** than other Safer Towns and crime has remained fairly stable, contrary to the increasing trend seen across Cornwall.
- Small rises in **violence, alcohol-related crimes, domestic abuse** and crimes where the **victim is aged under 18**.
- An increase in **shoplifting** offences but **numbers are low** compared with other Safer Towns.
- **Anti-social behaviour incidents reduced by 20%**, similar to the reducing rate across Cornwall.
- Overall, as a town **Saltash** area scores **lower than average** on the **Vulnerability Index**. There are **pockets of higher vulnerability**, however, particularly related to domestic abuse. Saltash **Warfleton** has a higher rate of local people known to **drug and alcohol treatment** services and to **domestic abuse** services.


