

Trelawny Gardens

Specification for replacement pathways

Location

Trelawny Gardens is located on Trelawny Road PL14 3TS



Background

Trelawny Garden is a public open space located on the outskirts of Menheniot Village centre. It was originally waste ground, but was adopted by a concerned resident who sourced funding to regenerate the space and create a communal green area in the centre of this local housing development. The gardens are now owned by the parish council who contribute to the cost of maintenance that is carried out by volunteers.

The gardens consist of a centre 'stone circle' that is the starting point for a pathway that links the elements of the garden together. There are flower beds and trees around the perimeter.

The pathway

The current pathway has deteriorated and needs to be replaced. It covers an area approximately 156sqm (that is, 30m x 1.2m)

What is needed

Clear the current path of foliage and provide a clean base to start. All waste to be disposed of and waste transfer documentation provided.

Provide both sides of the path metal rods and four by one tanalised timber for side timbers.

Lay high-quality weed proof membrane to the surface under 3/4 of an inch to dust fill material levelled and compacted.

Next steps
